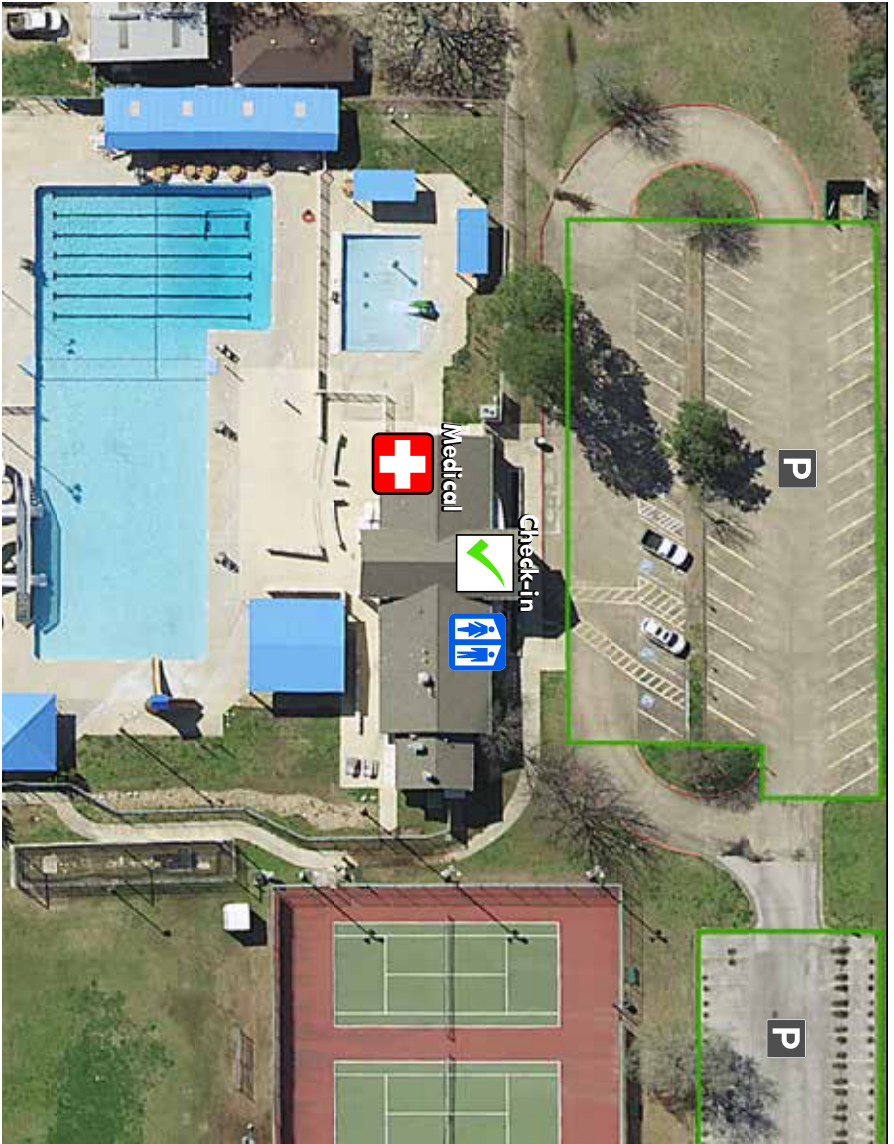

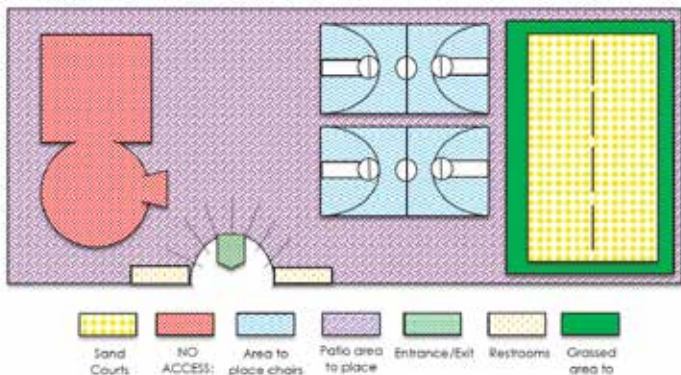
Concession Area
