Greetings from Waco where the preparation for the 2010 Games is nearly complete. Despite temperatures nearing 105, TAAF President Elect Jeff Goodman reports that setup at the Waco Water Park and Hart-Patterson track will be finished today, while the boxing ring was set at Waco High yesterday.

Boxing weigh-in took place today and there are 180 pre-entries. Early registration totals are up above 6,500 participants.

The swimming and track and field competitions begin at 2 p.m. Thursday. Golf also begins tomorrow at 8 a.m.
